The Washington State Legislature adjourned sine die early evening on Friday, two days before the end of the regular 105-day regular session. Governor Inslee has called a special session to begin on Wednesday April 29. The special session can last for 30 days. The special session was called because legislators have not yet agreed on a two year operating budget as well as other major issues including responding to the McCleary decision to adequately fund K-12 education, a transportation funding proposal, and a capital budget.

Budget negotiators will be in Olympia on Monday April 27 to renew discussion on these major issues. The differences in the approach by the House and Senate in the operating budget remains the primary issue of focus as the House relies on \$1.9 billion in increased taxes (B&O tax increase, capital gains tax, closing various tax preferences) and the Senate budget relies on the \$3 billion in increased state revenues expected next biennium to fund state programs. In addition House Democrats working with the Governor and some Senate Democrats have developed a revised cap and trade proposal that would raise around \$500M to be dedicated to education.

Traditionally during a special session legislators will be on a “rolling recess, where all legislators are in Olympia once or twice a week, but allowed to go home the rest of the week until progress has been made by negotiators on the major issues. While this decision has not been made, the current rumor is that after the special session begins on Wednesday, legislators will then begin a rolling recess.

Transportation deliberations appear to be advancing as well as capital budget discussions. However, action on these two issues is unlikely to occur until an agreement on the operating budget.
