Pigmentary Uveitis in the Golden Retriever & Systemic Hypertension

Pigmentary Uveitis is a common inherited condition in the Golden Retriever breed. It is very treatable if diagnosed in the early stages, but untreated leads to vision loss and often intractable discomfort due to glaucoma. We will discuss clinical findings and appropriate treatment in the early, mid, and late stages of this condition. Systemic hypertension leads to predictable changes in appearance and function of the eye. These often resolve with appropriate treatment. We will discuss findings and sequelae in dogs and cats.
