Levels of Supervision	
Immediate Supervision	The supervisor is in audible and visual range of the animal patient and the person treating the patient.
Direct supervision:	The veterinary supervisor is on the premises, is quickly and easily available and the animal patient has been examined by a veterinarian at such times as acceptable veterinary medical practice requires, consistent with the particular delegated animal health care task.
Indirect supervision:	The supervisor is not on the premises, but has given either written or oral instructions for treatment of the animal patient and the animal patient has been examined by a veterinarian at such times as acceptable veterinary medical practice requires, consistent with the particular delegated animal health care task and the animal patient is not anesthetized.
Hospital Personnel Definitions	
Licensed veterinary technician:	Any person who has met the requirements of Chapter 18.92.015 RCW and who is licensed as required by Chapter 18.92 RCW.
Registered Vet. Medication Clerk:	A person who has met requirements for registration per Chapter 246.937.040 WAC.
Supervisor:	A veterinarian or a licensed veterinary technician employed under the supervision of a veterinarian per Chapter WAC 246-935-010.
Unregistered assistant:	Any individual who is not a licensed veterinary technician or veterinarian.
Veterinarian:	A person authorized by Chapter 18.92 RCW to practice veterinary medicine in the state of Washington.

<sup>\*\*</sup>Unregistered assistants must be directly supervised by a Veterinarian (not a Veterinary Technician) when administering veterinary biologics for rabies and those diseases listed in WAC 16-42-026(2).

<sup>--</sup> Licensed Veterinary Technicians (LVTs) and unregistered assistants may perform tasks not specifically listed under indirect supervision unless otherwise restricted per Chapter 246.935.050 (7) WAC.
